BIG PICTURE

- In 2016, voters passed a dedicated sales tax to support Kitsap Transit's plan for a fast-ferry service on these routes.
- The Bremerton Fast Ferry began service in July 2017 and currently has high reliability and ridership.
- Kingston and Southworth have no direct connection now to Downtown Seattle.
- Current travel time from Kingston to Seattle via bus, auto ferry, or rail:

Kingston-Bainbridge-Seattle: > 70 min Kingston-Edmonds-Seattle: > 73 min

FERRIES

Finest will be primary vessel on the route

- Capacity for 250 passengers initially
- Capacity for 16 bicycles (inside cabin)
- Crossing time of 39 minutes
- Side-loader




FERRIES

Melissa Ann will be back-up vessel on the route

- Capacity for 172 passengers
- Capacity for 18 bicycles (inside cabin)
- Same crossing time as Finest
- Side-loader



- One-way fares are payable with exact cash or ORCA E-purse. Ferry operators do not give change.
- Reduced Fare: To qualify for a reduced fare, customers must show a valid Medicare Card or a Regional Reduced Fare Permit (RRFP) or be prequalified at a customer service center.



Drops off only at ferry




HOW IT WILL WORK




KINGSTON RIDE (MID-DAY SERVICE)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How did you develop the sailing schedule?

A: The sailing schedule was developed based on the time slots available at the Seattle dock and input from the community survey. There may be opportunities in the future to make changes to the schedule, as we have with the Bremerton Fast Ferry.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is Kitsap Transit doing to reduce traffic congestion around the ferry terminal?

A: Kitsap Transit is providing additional bus services and Park & Ride capacity to reduce the need for commuters to park their cars at the ferry terminal. Buses will use the tollbooth lane to access the terminal for drop-offs/pick-ups.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Will you have a reservations system as you do on the Bremerton Fast Ferry?

A: No, not at this time. Kitsap Transit believes the Kingston Fast Ferry has more than enough capacity to handle the demand. A reservation system is needed for the Bremerton service because demand exceeds vessel capacity.
